Any adult 18 years of age or older, a high school graduate, or an individual between the ages of 16 and 18 who has officially withdrawn from high school is eligible to enroll in continuing education classes. High school students, 16 or older, are permitted to enroll under the dual enrollment policy with approval from the appropriate school officials. Pre-registration and payment of registration fees are required five (5) business days before the class start date for Continuing Education classes.

Courses are offered at the Williamston Campus, Bertie Campus, and other community sites in Martin and Bertie Counties. Schedules are published prior to the start of each semester. However, the Division has the flexibility to offer courses on request that are customized to meet the needs of individuals, groups, industries, or other community service agencies. 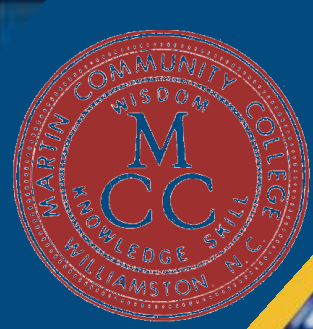

This class (420-hours of training) will meet Monday - Thursday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the MCC campus in Williamston (1161 Kehukee Park Road). However, once the class gets underway, the meeting hours will vary to accommodate outdoor activities.

The fee for this class is \$180. However, financial aid is available and students are encouraged to apply.

Starting wages for apprentice line technicians in eastern NC are generally around \$17/hour with seasoned veterans reaching an average of \$50/hour.

Upon successful completion of the Academy, students will become desirable candidates for employment among numerous municipal, rural, and commercial power providers.

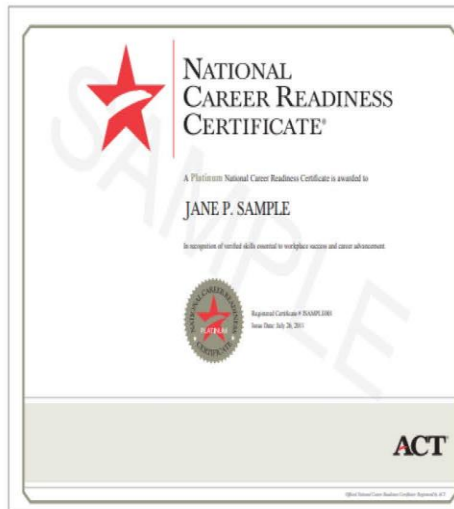

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CLASSES

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY "BEGINNERS"

FIRE ALARM INSTALL/TECHNICIAN CERTIFICATE

This 96-hour course will cover the proper installation of a fire alarm system and all of the components within the system. The student will learn the proper installation of the different components, and how they are wired together for a Class A or Class B system

and the difference of each. The course will also instruct the student from the NFPA72 FA code along with the NFPA70 NEC.

NOTARY

This course provides instruction to individuals who want to become commissioned as a notary public or those who are up for re-certification. Topics include legal, ethical and procedural requirements of the Notary Act as described in N.C. General Statute 10B Article 1. Pre-requisites: Student must be at least 18 years of age, NC resident, US citizen and have a valid State or Federal picture ID, no felony conviction, no conviction of corruption, malpractice or impeachment.; posses a high school diploma or equivalent. Upon completion of this course with a passing exam grade of 80 percent, a person is eligible to make application with the NC Secretary of State's Office. Textbook Required.

SPANISH for BEGINNERS

This course provides an introduction to understanding, speaking, reading, and writing Spanish. Emphasis is placed on pronunciation, parts of speech, communicative phrases, culture, and skills for language acquisition. Upon completion, students should be able to identify and apply basic grammar concepts, display cultural awareness, and communicate simple Spanish phrases.

VEHICLE SAFETY INSPECTION- NCDMV

This course is designed to meet the training and licensing requirements (initial and/or renewal) for the Vehicle Safety Inspection Program administered by the N.C. Division of Motor Vehicles, License, and Theft Bureau. Upon completion, a student will understand the rules, regulations, and procedures for conducting a vehicle safety inspection; be able to inspect a vehicle properly; and be prepared to sit for the state certification exam. In addition, each student must be employed at an inspection station and possess a valid N.C. driver's license.

Upon completion, students will have the knowledge base to sit for various industry-specific certifications.
