

#### NOTARY

This course provides instruction to individuals who want to become commissioned as a notary public or those who are up for re-certification. Topics include legal, ethical and procedural requirements of the Notary Act as described in N.C. General Statue 10B Article 1. Pre-requisites: Student must be at least 18 years of age, NC resident, US citizen and have a valid State or Federal picture ID, no felony conviction, no conviction of corruption, malpractice or impeachment.; posses a high school diploma or equivalent. Upon completion of this course with a passing exam grade of 80 percent, a person is eligible to make application with the NC Secretary of State's Office. Textbook Required.
