THE DIVISION OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Division of Continuing Education at Martin Community College operates under the philosophy that learning is a lifelong process, extending beyond formal education and continuing throughout one's life. Pre-requisites: Student must be at least 18 years of age, NC resident, US citizen and have a valid State or Federal picture ID, no felony conviction, no conviction of corruption, malpractice or impeachment.; possess a high school diploma or equivalent. Upon completion of this course with a passing exam grade of 80 percent, a person is eligible to make application with the NC Secretary of State's Office. Textbook Required.

MCC SOLAR TECHNICIAN TRAINING CERTIFICATION

STEPS4GROWTH Clean Energy Program

This 7-week intensive program is designed to provide the foundational training for a person to enter the solar workforce as an entry level technician. Participants will engage with foundational training with a focus on hands-on experience in a controlled lab. Throughout the 7-weeks, participants will engage with regional employers looking to hire skilled workers. The course also has an online component to include the national OSHA-30 certification and course preparation work in Moodle.

Emphasis is placed on pronunciation, parts of speech, communicative phrases, culture, and skills for language acquisition. Upon completion, students should be able to identify and apply basic grammar concepts, display cultural awareness, and communicate simple Spanish phrases.

Upon completion, a student will understand the rules, regulations, and procedures for conducting a vehicle safety inspection; be able to inspect a vehicle properly; and be prepared to sit for the state certification exam. In addition, each student must be employed at an inspection station and possess a valid N.C. driver's license.
