<p>The Career and College Promise (CCP) ADN Pathway is designed for high school students who wish to begin their educational studies toward the Associate in Nursing degree and a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing. The Pathway is based on Block 1 of the <i>Uniform Articulation Agreement</i> between the University of North Carolina's Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs and the North Carolina Community College Associate Degree Nursing Programs which was approved by the State Board of Community Colleges and the UNC Board of Governors in February 2015.</p> <p>-</p> <p>A student who completes an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing, which includes the courses listed above, with a GPA of at least 2.0 and a grade of C or better and completes the courses in Blocks 2-3 of the <i>Uniform Articulation Agreement</i> between the University of North Carolina's Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs and the North Carolina Community College Associate Degree Nursing Programs with a GPA of at least 2.0 and a grade of C or better, and who holds a current unrestricted license as a Registered Nurse in North Carolina will have fulfilled the UNC institutions lower-division general education requirements as well as nursing program entry requirements. However, because nursing program admissions are competitive, no student is guaranteed admission to the program of his or her choice.</p> <p>-</p> <p>Most Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) programs require the successful completion of Nurse Aid I, passing of the state NA I exam, as well as current CPR certification as part of their eligibility requirements for the program. Students are encouraged to research their desired school to ensure they complete all eligibility requirements for application.</p>
