## 2022-2023 Career-in-a-Year & MCC Commitment Scholarship

### *FAQs for Curriculum Students*

**1. What are the Career-in-a-Year (CIY) and MCC Commitment (MCCC) Scholarship programs?**

*The CIY and MCCC programs are last-dollar tuition and fees scholarship programs that ensure students who enrolled in eligible programs and are awarded will have their tuition and eligible fees paid.*

*All North Carolina residents who pay in-state tuition are eligible to apply for a CIY Scholarship.*

*All Martin County and Bertie County residents or graduates of a Martin County or Bertie County School or homeschool who graduated in the years 19-20, 20-21, or 21-22 are eligible to apply for a MCCC Scholarship.*

**2. Are all students required to complete the college admission application?**

*Yes. Students are required to complete the college admission application. Visit [cfnc.org](http://cfnc.org) to apply.*

**3. Are all students required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)?**

*Yes. Students are required to complete the FAFSA. Visit [studentaid.gov](http://studentaid.gov) to apply.*

**4. Are all students required to complete the MCC Scholarship Application?**

*Yes. Students are required to complete the MCC Scholarship Application. Visit [martincc.edu/scholarships](http://martincc.edu/scholarships) to apply.*

- 5. The CIY and MCC Scholarship Applications will be accepted for students enrolling in the 2022 Fall Semester. Will these scholarship opportunities be available to new students starting in 2023 Spring?**

*Maybe. Students wishing to enroll in a curriculum program are strongly encouraged to enroll in the 2022 Fall semester. Depending on funding availability, CIY and MCCC Scholarships may be available in the 2023 Spring; a decision has not been made.*

- 6. How long do CIY students have to complete their CIY programs using CIY funds?**

*CIY students have a maximum of 3 semesters (2022 Fall, 2023 Spring, & 2023 Summer) to complete their program. Students must start 2022FA. Some programs require less than 3 semesters to complete. Students may complete a CIY program beyond the one-year timeframe but may need to pay “out of pocket” or seek other scholarships.*

- 7. How long do MCCC students have to complete their MCCC programs using MCCC funds?**

*MCCC students have a maximum of 4 (Fall/Spring/Fall/Spring) semesters to complete their programs. Students must start 2022FA. Some programs require less than 3 semesters to complete. Students may complete a MCCC program beyond the four-semester timeframe but may need to “pay out of pocket” or seek other scholarships.*

- 8. Will these programs cover student fees? If so, which fees?**

*Yes. Both programs will cover Student Activity Fees, Technology Fees, Science Lab Fees, and Equine Fees.*

- 9. Are transition and co-requisite course tuition costs included?**

*Yes. All courses must be part of an eligible program.*

- 10. Can a student receive more than one CIY or MCCC Scholarship?**

*No. Eligible students will receive one CIY or one MCCC Scholarship.*

- 11. Are books and supplies costs included?**

*No.*

- 12. Will students receive any “cash-in-hand”? Will students receive a disbursement?**

*No.*

**13. Are out-of-state students eligible?**

*No. To be eligible, students must qualify for the in-state tuition rate.*

**14. May all students apply, even those who have a high expected family contribution (EFC)?**

*Yes.*

**15. May returning students apply?**

*Returning students who have not previously been awarded a CIY or MCCC Scholarship may apply.*

**16. Must returning students be in good academic standing or maintaining satisfactory academic performance (SAP)?**

*Students are not required to be in good academic standing or maintaining SAP to be eligible to apply for a CIY Scholarship. Continued eligibility is dependent upon maintaining SAP.*

*Students are required to be in good academic standing and maintaining SAP to be eligible to apply for a MCCC Scholarship. Continued eligibility is dependent upon maintaining SAP.*

**17. Are students eligible if they have exceeded their FA lifetime eligibility?**

*Yes. (CIY)*

*No. (MCCC)*

**18. Should Career and College Promise (high school) students apply?**

*No. However, High School students may be eligible for a tuition waiver through the Career and College Promise Program. Students should discuss enrollment opportunities with their high school counselor or with someone in the MCC High School Programs office. **19. Are students eligible for CIY or MCCC if they have already received a college credential?**

*Students are not eligible if they have received a college credential within the last three (3) years.*
